Before The couple's bedroom was very functional but it was lacking visual variety and warmth. They had a king-size bed, large white wardrobes and lots of cupboards with drawers. The decor in the room was all-white too, but without layers and texture it didn't feel an inviting space to relax. "I found the main problem was that it was white, white, white and lacking in any personality," Jason says.

After "To give the room a more luxurious look and to add texture I used linen curtains and sheers," Jason explains. "I chose the grey fabric-covered bed base because it looked warm and inviting and it was kind of reminiscent of the old water beds, even though this one does have a mattress." To add contrast, Jason replaced a white chest of drawers with a blonde wood sideboard. The bedside tables were also replaced with ones that had a few more design details, and a vintage-looking artwork was added for colour. @
